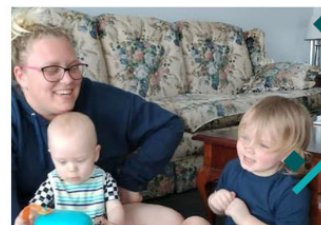
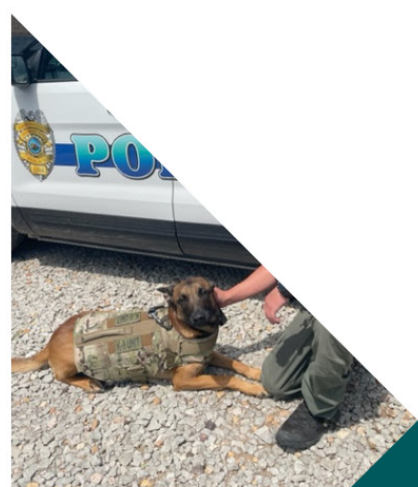

Many readers might recall in past PACF Annual Reports seeing images and stories of Irene Conaway. Through her Harry E. Moats Scholarship Fund and the A. Bertram and Irene J. Conaway Scholarship Fund, Mrs. Conaway supported more than 100 area students. Each year, she'd gather her recent award recipients at North Bend State Park and treat them to lunch and friendly conversation; and she saw them as her "family."

Mrs. Conaway was a Registered Nurse and volunteered her time with the Ritchie County EMS, Ritchie County Schools, Red Cross, and many other area organizations. In addition to her desire to support area youth, she also was committed to her community and was a steadfast supporter of area needs, the PACF, and the Foundation's Ritchie County Community Foundation affiliate. She and her husband, Bert, also founded the Wood County Christian School Endowment Fund with the PACF.

In August of 2019, Mrs. Conaway passed away at the age of 93. As a Legacy Society member, she left a gift to the Foundation in her estate plans to support her scholarship funds and community - a gift that will forever keep giving.

BEING A GIVING FAMILY MATTERS

“At the end of the day, we want our children and our grandchildren to know that we cared about our family and our community. Our legacy will be to leave this world just a little better off for our having been here.”

Curtis Miller was born in the year that his father and role model, Paul Miller, began his own business in 1962, the Miller Insurance Agency. The Insurance Agency has been an integral part of the Miller family's lives for as long as Curtis Miller can recall; he remembers visiting his dad's office at the young age of three, the same age as one of his own grandchildren now. Curtis said, “I learned so many life lessons from my father. Though he passed away in 2011, I can still hear his voice in my head as I make important life decisions.”

A life-long Parkersburg resident, Paul Miller was a first-generation American of German heritage who played football at Parkersburg High School (PHS), as well as football and wrestling at Marshall University. While Miller came from a low wealth background, he was ambitious and worked hard; first for a local accountant, then starting his own accounting business, and going on to build a successful career as a small business owner in the insurance field. He was proud of his community and carried a passion for wanting life to be better for others. The slogan of the company that he started exemplifies his ideals, “the insurance company that cares about you.”

Following in his father's footsteps, Curtis attended PHS, where he, too, was an outstanding athlete. He was inducted into the Big Reds Football Hall of Fame in 2017, having served as a Captain of the PHS team as did his father and two brothers. After graduating from PHS, he began attending WVU at Parkersburg while working part-time at the family insurance agency in 1982. He later graduated from Glenville State and in 1994, he became the sole owner of Curtis Miller Insurance Agency.

Following his marriage to Ginger Kelley, the Millers established the Mid-Ohio Valley as their home. Ginger was a graduate of Parkersburg South High School, Camden Clark School of Radiology

and Salem University. In her early career she was an X-ray tech for Camden Clark and Radiology Services. She finished her career as a property manager for the family rental business.

The Millers have been married 37 years. “We encourage our children to become involved in their communities, giving of their time and talents, as well as their resources,” said Curtis. “A local community is only successful if its young people become involved. Wood County has given us many outstanding examples of leaders in prior generations and like many parts of the country, we need our young people to step into those leadership roles now.”

Miller himself provides a strong example of community leadership, having served on the Board of Governors of WVU at Parkersburg for nine years, and on the Board of Directors of the Parkersburg Area Community Foundation (PACF) for ten years, holding the honor of an emeritus seat on its Board

The Millers have a Donor Advised Fund through the PACF, the Curtis and Ginger Miller Donor Advised Fund. “We use our fund with the PACF to support a wide variety of community causes, such as the YMCA and its upcoming locker room renovation project,” said Curtis. “We believe in supporting our local high schools, the Art Center and the Actor’s Guild. We’re always amazed at the amount of talent in our community and we’re interested in local groups that are working to help to make our community better. Our donor advised fund allows us to support many different causes with the ease of one giving account. PACF makes it easy for us to do good.”

The Millers have two daughters, Brittany Miller Meadows (married to Kelly Meadows) of Richmond, VA, and Lexi Miller Adkins (married to Andrew Adkins). They have three grandchildren living in Richmond. They were delighted that Lexi and her husband returned to the Mid-Ohio Valley. Lexi is now the third generation to work at Curtis Miller Insurance Agency. She is active with the PACF Development Committee and joined the PACF Board recently.

The Miller family has deep roots in Wood County and wants to see it thrive. Curtis summarized his thoughts saying, “PACF has done a great job of connecting so many different people and organizations for years. Now it is time for the next generation to take its place in our community at the leadership table. We need more inclusion and more voices, to guide the future of our community to its best outcomes.”

PLANNING AHEAD MATTERS

One family's dedication to the community continues forever through their gift to the community foundation.

When Suzanne and Tom Bayley made their home in the Parkersburg area in 1946, they were committed to the betterment of the region and quickly involved themselves in area programs and causes.

Born and raised in Parkersburg, Suzanne L. Bayley had a passion for theater. She lived in New York for many years and spent two summers with the Rollins Studio for John Drew Theater in the village of East Hampton on Long Island prior to her marriage to Thomas "Tom" W. Bayley, Jr. in 1942. She and her husband resided in Los Angeles, CA and Fayetteville, NC during World War II. They returned to Parkersburg in 1946, later building a home and moving to Vienna in 1956.

Tom was a Senior Partner in the firm of Burk and Bayley in Parkersburg and a successful attorney. Active in a wide variety of charitable organizations, including the Actors Guild of Parkersburg and the Blennerhassett Historical Foundation, Tom also served as President of the Parkersburg Country Club and as a the City Attorney for Williamstown for many years.

In addition to these many accomplishments, he played a significant role in the development of charters for the Parkersburg Area Community Foundation (PACF) and served on the first Board of Directors for the Foundation in 1963. His dream of developing a "top-notch, first class" community foundation to serve the region continues nearly 60 years later.

Suzanne was very active in the local community, supporting organizations such as the Junior League of Parkersburg and the Children's Theatre Bureau. She helped to found Artsbridge and served as Executive Director for the opening of the original production of *Eden on the River* on the Blennerhassett Island. She received numerous accolades and awards for her involvement in the community and her promotion of the local arts and culture programs.

Suzanne was particularly active with the Actors Guild of Parkersburg. She began her involvement by directing and acting in plays. She assisted with raising funds for the renovation of the current theatre, acquired in the 1970's and located at Eight and Market Streets. She helped design renovations for this facility and worked on an ongoing basis to secure funding for various upgrades. Research conducted by the Guild showed that it was more difficult to raise funds for capital needs than for programming needs.

Inspired by this research, Suzanne and Tom created the Actors Guild Preservation Fund with the PACF in 1992. The Bayley's goal was to give the Guild a "safety net" to maintain their physical building, now and in the future. To date, the Fund has awarded more than \$100,000 to support the Guild with preservation, maintenance, repair, and improvement of its theatre property.

After Tom passed away in 1996, Suzanne remained

active with many area organizations and continued to support and promote the programs and causes close to her family's hearts. In 2000, she created the Suzanne L. Bayley Charitable Fund with the PACF. Then before her passing in 2010, Suzanne made provisions in her estate plans to support this important charitable fund with a gift to support her community more broadly.

Following her passing, with her estate plan gift, her fund was renamed the Suzanne L. Bayley Memorial Fund. This fund will forever deliver flexible grant funds for the PACF to use to support the community that Suzanne and her husband called "home."

To date, the Suzanne L. Bayley Memorial Fund has awarded \$7,100 to support our community, including

a recent donation that supported production of a nationally distributed documentary highlighting our region's deep history, *Treason Island: The Blennerhassetts and Aaron Burr*.

Suzanne and Tom's generosity fueled two separate charitable funds to support the Actors Guild of Parkersburg and the PACF's community grants through its Community Action Grants Program. These two funds are a charitable legacy that will last for generations, a fitting tribute to the Bayley family's dedication to our community.

Since their establishment, the Actors Guild Preservation Fund and the Suzanne L. Bayley Memorial Fund have awarded more than \$100,000 to support the Actors Guild of Parkersburg. Recent year's grants included funds to support the costs related to refacing the exterior of the building, to install a sprinkler system, and to update the lighting fixtures.

HAVING A PLACE TO CALL “HOME” MATTERS

Donors and the PACF help Habitat for Humanity of the Mid-Ohio Valley’s impact to reach beyond construction

Known for its vision of creating affordable, quality housing for families in need, Habitat for Humanity of the Mid-Ohio Valley (MOV) aims to provide more than low-cost housing. Habitat works to break down barriers, build relationships, educate homeowners, and to create an environmentally and economically sustainable community.

Alvin Phillips, Executive Director of Habitat for Humanity of the MOV, explains how the organization reaches beyond constructing homes.

“We want to do more than build houses; we want to teach individuals how to be successful homeowners. So, we touch on finance, maintenance, paperwork, insurance, neighbor relations---anything that can help them to maintain their home independently and successfully,” said Phillips.

While Habitat’s formal educational program works to eliminate barriers that can make it difficult for families to keep their homes, Habitat’s practices at

the building job site seek to deconstruct community level barriers that are less tangible. Habitat’s work projects unite individuals of diverse backgrounds in building a home, in order to cultivate a community of acceptance.

“One of the most valuable experiences in our organization is the relationship building that occurs at a construction site,” Phillips said. “The homeowners and volunteers work together, so the projects bring together folks who have means with ones who do not, which helps each to be more aware of the needs of the other. The job sites are a place of mutual learning and understanding.”

Thanks to many generous donors who have provided PACF with flexible grantmaking dollars or have set up permanent annual support funds, Habitat has continuously benefited from the Parkersburg Area Community Foundation’s competitive Community Action Grants Program, and from grants awarded through Donor Advised and Designated Funds. In the last decade, Habitat for Humanity has received more than \$1 million in grants from the PACF to support its operations, store expansion, and home construction funding.

In 2016, Habitat initiated a major improvement by relocating its ReStore (since 2006, previously located in a 2,000 square foot building) to an 11,000 square foot building. The relocation to Vienna, WV, was made possible by a \$700,000 donation through the PACF from a charitable fund founded by Mary “Mickey” Welch. “Mickey and the Mary M. Welch Advised Fund have given tremendous support to Habitat MOV, enabling us to pay for the store as well as a new roof,” said Phillips.

The Restore provides low cost, sustainable housing materials to community members while also delivering funds to supply Habitat’s home building projects. Approximately one year of Restore earnings supplies



enough revenue to pay for two homes to be built.

A recent \$10,000 grant from the Dr. Athey and Veronica Lutz Fund, combined with a \$5,000 grant from the Dennie G. and Marie R. Wolfe Fund, both PACF funds, is helping to build another Habitat Restore, with ground-breaking set for 2023.

“Affordable housing is a huge need in our

community, especially as housing prices continue rising,” said Marian Clowes, former PACF Associate Director. “Habitat creates affordable housing and engages both those in need of quality housing as well as community volunteers in the construction work, building relationships, and improving the lives of area residents. Collectively, we are all working to build a better community and a better future for our residents.”



Mary “Mickey” Welch (pictured right) was a tremendous supporter of Habitat during her lifetime. She donated to it directly and through her Donor Advised Fund managed by the PACF. Her support and care in providing affordable housing to area citizens continues through her memorial fund, the Mary M. Welch Advised Fund, for which her daughter Mary Anne Ketelsen (pictured left) is the Fund Advisor.



Habitat installed a new large sign for their ReStore located in Vienna with help from a Community Action Grant from the PACF. The Foundation has awarded thousands in grant support to assist both Habitat and its ReStore. Whether funds are supplied for capital improvements or operating support, the Foundation’s intentional grantmaking is impacting the lives of area citizens and making home ownership more attainable.

AN OUTSTANDING TEACHER LEAVES A LEGACY THAT MATTERS

Coming together to forever support local educator's love of education.

April Tibbs loved teaching and loved her students. Beginning her career as a teacher at Parkersburg High School for two years, and next teaching at Parkersburg South High School (PSHS) for twelve years, she taught Journalism, Yearbook, Newspaper, English, and night school. April was "all in" for her students.

Born in Parkersburg, on July 4, 1974, April attended local schools. After graduating from Parkersburg South High School, where she held honors as a National Merit Finalist, she received her bachelor's degree in English from The Ohio State University. She next attended Mount Vernon Nazarene University, receiving a master's degree and being recognized as the most outstanding student teacher in her class. In addition to teaching, April was a huge Ohio State Buckeye fan and enjoyed scrapbooking and crafting. She also loved the theater, and for many years, looked forward to traveling with her good friend, Faith, to Broadway plays in Columbus, Ohio. April's love of her students extended well beyond classroom teaching.

In 2017, April attended classes to become a foster parent, and subsequently became a foster mother for one of her students who needed a home. Only a year later, at the age of 44, in December of 2018, she was

diagnosed with stage four colon cancer.

"Through all her chemotherapy treatments and many surgeries, she fought like the firecracker she was; she never gave up hope of conquering this horrible disease," said April's mother, Deanne Tibbs. "But, sadly, April passed away in December 2020."



April's family established the April Lee Tibbs Memorial Scholarship with the PACF in January 2021 to honor her love of teaching by training future educators. The generous support of her family and friends has created a permanent scholarship fund that will forever support a high school senior graduating from PSHS, majoring in Multimedia, Journalism, Communications, and/or English.

The April Lee Tibbs Memorial Scholarship made its first award in the spring of 2022 and provided a \$500 scholarship to Hannah Parsons of Parkersburg. Hannah plans to attend WVU at Parkersburg to major in Elementary Education - English Language and Literature.

"In my years as a student, I have had excellent teachers. They have positively impacted my academic career, and I will remember their actions for a lifetime. I aspire to be like my teachers before me. My goal is to positively expand my students' minds while having fun. I want to thank you again for your generosity. It is an honor to be selected for this scholarship. I can assure you that I will work hard to be a successful student and achieve my goals in the process."

(CLP), continues to raise awareness regarding the importance of their endowment fund with the PACF by regularly encouraging individuals to support their Children's Listening Place Endowment Fund or to create their own named fund. Through their efforts, and inspired by a childhood friend, an anonymous donor has created the Brady Memorial Fund to forever support the CLP's work to protect and support area youth who are victims of abuse.

In addition to support from these two funds of the PACF, the CLP was recently the recipient of a Community Action Grant from the Foundation. This \$7,500 grant, made possible by the Walter E. and Marie Aussenheimer Memorial Fund, Mountaineer Children at Risk Fund, and the Holmes Family Fund, helped purchase a new passenger van that allows the CLP to provide transportation to children and families served by the organization.

"To be able to provide transportation for those families that do not have any is an amazing feeling," said Candice Gabriel, CLP Program Supervisor. "It shouldn't matter what you have, to be able to receive help for physical and sexual abuse is a must. This is a very stressful time for these families; to be able to make it a little easier for them is a wonderful feeling."

The van also transports staff, like Creighton, CLP's therapy dog, to meetings and training opportunities.

The Parkersburg Art Center’s facilities are better protected from fire, thanks to a \$9,000 PACF grant, which helped the Art Center install a fire suppression system in their building at 713 Market Street.

The building now houses a market where area artists can sell their work. The market has become the new home for Riverside Artists, a long-standing artists’ co-op in Marietta, who lost the lease on their shop in December 2021. Co-op members were seeking a place to sell their art, and the Parkersburg Art Center’s new market was a perfect fit.

“Riverside’s closure was sad but it was so fortuitous that the Art Center Artists’ Market was about to open at that time,” said Virginia Killian, founding member of the Riverside Artist Gallery. “We’ve had so many great artists show their work at Riverside. I am happy that we have a wonderful new home where we can exhibit and sell.”



The Doddridge County Parks and Recreation Commission received \$5,000 from the Doddridge County Community Foundation (DCCF) affiliate and \$10,000 from the PACF through the spring 2021 Community Action Grants Program. The grant was to support phase two of the pool development project. In phase two, the Park will replace and upgrade the main pool. The DCCF's support is made possible, in part, with a donation from the EQT Foundation.

"The Doddridge County Park system is constantly striving to improve our facilities and make the guests' visit a positive experience," said Greg Cottrill, Park Director. "The Park will be launching into phase two of its pool renovations and the grants from PACF and DCCF will help us achieve the financial goal needed to make that happen. We also appreciate the continuing support of the EQT Foundation as we work to make Doddridge County a great place for recreation."

Students in Wood County schools learned about the importance of healthy eating, and were able to "buy" their own fruits and vegetables this year, thanks to Pop-Up Farmers Markets sponsored by WVU Extension's Family Nutrition Program with a PACF grant.

A \$9,500 grant from the PACF funded "Kids Koupans" for the students to use to purchase produce provided by local farmers. The grant was made possible by the Mary M. Welch Advised Fund and the Friends of Parkersburg Day Nursery Fund.

One 4th grade student at Madison Elementary School shared the impact of the project with Rebecca Marks, program director:

"Dear Mrs. Marks, you have inspired me to eat healthy. If you were not here I would be eating junk food, junk food, junk food every single day over and over. I really did need this. I know this will have a big impact on me. Junk food will never take over my body again. This has been one of the best things that ever happened to me. I hope you are proud to have inspired many kids in our classroom."

Wood County Parks and Recreation Commission

\$9,995 to purchase a wood splitter for the Mountwood Park Family Campgrounds.

Wood County Society

\$6,300 to purchase equipment for metalworks for the Artbeat Studio.

Wood County Sports Association

\$7,500 to replace fencing and repair parking lots.

WVU Extension / Family Nutrition Program

\$9,500 to support pop-up farmers markets at Wood County schools.

WVU Foundation / Children's Vision Rehabilitation Program

\$5,250 to support clinics to assess and assist children with low vision in the PACF service area.

YMCA of Parkersburg

\$15,000 to install LED lighting throughout the facility.



Catholic Charities' Mobile WellnessWorks Food Pantry visits sites in Calhoun, Doddridge, Ritchie, Roane, and Wirt counties each month, bringing much needed food access to rural areas. A \$10,000 PACF grant helped to purchase a new box truck with refrigeration for the mobile food pantry. The mobile unit not only provides food, its staff also helps connect clients to programs and services to improve their lives for the long-term.

One Calhoun County client recently said, "My husband and I both lost our jobs due to the pandemic. Our cupboards were close to empty and we couldn't abide by our children being hungry, so we sought help. We went to the Catholic Charities pantry, and we were treated with the utmost respect and dignity by the coordinator and the volunteers. The coordinator also assisted us in signing up for SNAP benefits. A few days later, the coordinator called to check on us and also let us know about companies hiring in our county. We ended up following up on his tip and we are both still employed six months later."



Members of the Cairo Volunteer Fire Department are better equipped to fight fires thanks to a \$12,000 Community Action Grant. The grant was made possible by the Bruce and Judy Holmes Advised Fund, Ritchie County Grantmaking Fund, Walter E. and Marie Ausenheimer Memorial Fund, and the Dennis and Ruby Farley Memorial Fund.

The funding enabled the department to upgrade their portable radios to improve communication among firefighters. The department provides coverage for more than 3,000 residents in their service area. As a Cairo resident noted, "It is always reassuring knowing that our firefighters have the proper equipment. As a resident you hope you never have to call 9-1-1 but when you do it makes it so much easier trusting your fire department and trusting that they have the equipment needed to operate safely."

WORKING TOGETHER MATTERS

An affiliate is a component fund (or collection of component funds) created within the PACF to serve a defined geographic region and that uses a local advisory group. Operating as an affiliate of the PACF has significant benefits—it provides significant regional economy of scale for all administrative, management and investment purposes. At the same time, local leaders can focus their efforts on fund development and grantmaking for a specific area.

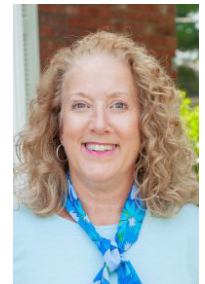

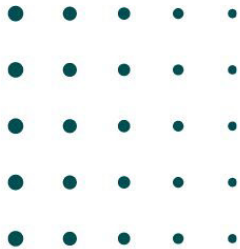
